»Women Rise and Excel«: Training camp for young women from Zimbabwe

Young people have little to say in Zimbabwe. This is increasingly the case for young women. Girls and young women are not only exposed to discrimination, but also to violence. The consequences are dropped out of school, teenage pregnancies and child marriages. To counteract these dangers, our partner organisation Youth Empowerment and Transformation Trust (YETT), Harare trains young women from all over Zimbabwe to take an active role in the community and society as «transformative leaders», also for the benefit of vulnerable girls and young women.

COMPONENTS

- Six-day intensive training programme for 30 young women mostly from disadvantaged rural communities.
- Application procedure via the youth organisations from the nationwide YETT network.
- The 10 modules are led by different facilitators. The topics are dealt with in individual and group work.
- Topics: Self-awareness & leadership; financial and entrepreneurial knowledge; civic engagement and advocacy for development; women's rights & equality; motivation and networking for local activities to protect vulnerable girls and young women.



«In the course I realised that I am not the only one, there are other young women who do not want to be the traditional, silent child and who criticise that society does not allow the voice of young women.
